

You will need

- ✓ Dylon 3D Paints
- ✓ Sheets of strong, clear plastic
- ✓ Cardboard
- ✓ Masking tape
- ✓ Selection of designs
- ✓ Iron

HINTS

- ◆ Glitter, Pearl or Glossy 3D Paints are suitable for 3-D window decorations.
- ◆ 3D Paints applied thickly will need to be left to dry thoroughly, preferably overnight.
- ◆ If the tube becomes blocked, free the flow of paint by inserting a large pin or needle into the nozzle once or twice.

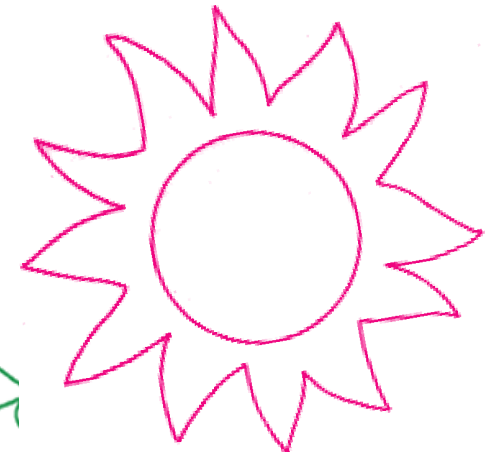
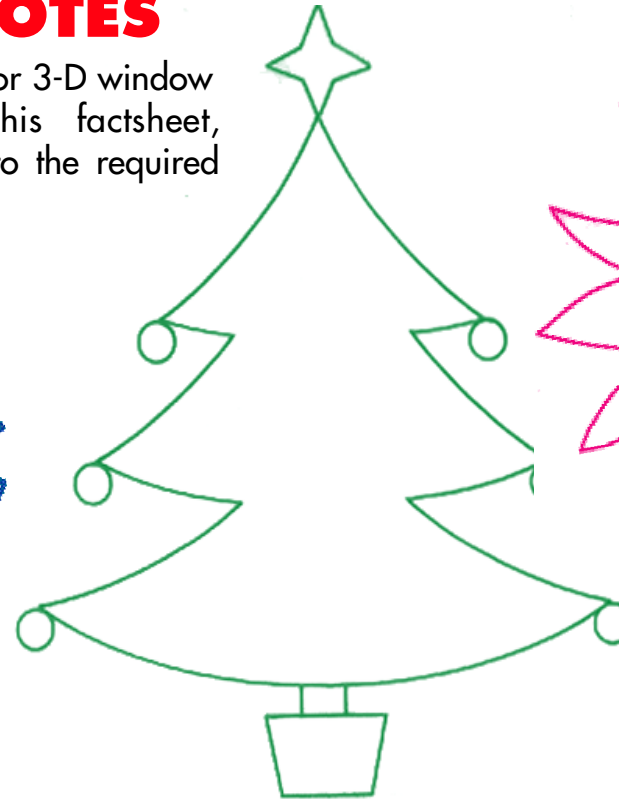
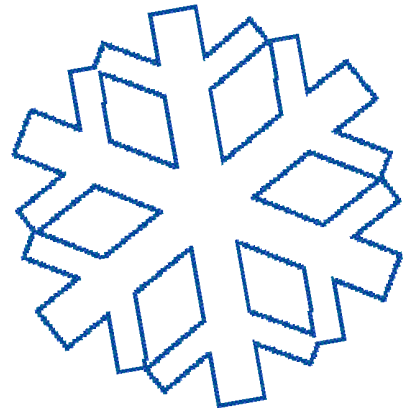
3D Paints may be used on fabric, thin applications will dry more quickly. Paints applied to fabrics are machine washable (a gentle wash) after 72 hours. Iron lightly on the reverse of the garment.

TEACHERS NOTES

3-D Window Decorations

Three dimensional fabric paint can be used to make decorations for your classroom windows
 - you could make snowflakes for Christmas, or spiders and webs for Halloween!



Draw your own design or trace or photocopy designs. Tape the picture to a piece of board - cover with a sheet of clear plastic and hold in place with masking tape.



Squeeze 3D Paint onto the plastic, following the lines of the design. You can fill in some areas with paint or just make an outline design. Make the lines of paint quite thick.



Let the paint dry overnight, then gently peel the design off the plastic backing - then press into place on the window..



You can use 3D Paints to decorate clothing or any other fabric items - pencil cases, canvas shoes, baseball caps, gloves...or make designs on card or paper for personalised gift tags and wrapping paper.
