

## You will need

- ✓ Image Maker
- ✓ Photocopied pictures
- ✓ Paintbrushes
- ✓ White cotton fabric
- ✓ Dylon 3D Paints
- ✓ Masking tape
- ✓ Paper towel
- ✓ Rolling pin

## HINTS

- ◆ Arrange passport photos of children onto A4 sheets of paper for photocopying, allowing a margin of about 2cm between each picture.
- ◆ When using Dylon 3D Paint for appliqué, take care not to touch the Dylon 3D Paint after application until it is completely dry.
- ◆ Remember, the Image Maker process reverses your picture, so always select pictures without words or numbers, or reverse photocopy.

## TEACHERS NOTES

Fabric photo labels are useful for quick and easy identification of sports kit, drawstring bags, school bags and children's clothing.



## Instructions

1. Wash fabric (even if new).
2. Take either a black and white or colour photocopy of picture.
3. Generously cover the picture with Image Maker so that the image cannot be seen clearly.
4. Place the print face down onto the fabric.
5. Cover the picture with a paper towel and roll over with a rolling pin. Wipe away excess paste with a cloth.
6. Allow to dry thoroughly, preferably overnight.
7. After it has dried, wet the image thoroughly with a sponge and rub gently until all the paper is removed. (Make sure all the paper has been removed.)
8. Allow to dry thoroughly.
9. Seal the picture by brushing a thin layer of Image Maker over it.

To appliqué the transferred design onto a garment or bag, place dots of Dylon 3D Paint at close intervals on the edge of the transfer, slightly overlapping onto the garment - this is an easier technique than attempting to make an even, continuous line.

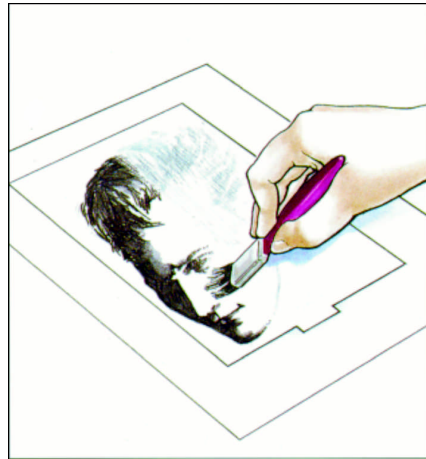

# Fabric Photo Labels with Dylon Image Maker

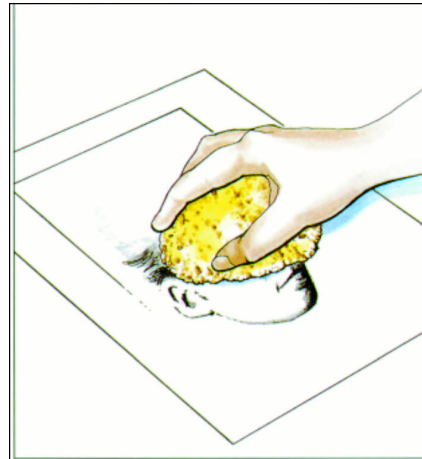
Photo labels are easy to make and can be put on bags or clothes.



Cut out the photocopy of your photograph, leaving a little 'tag' at one end, so you don't get Image Maker all over your hands.



Transfer the photocopy onto a piece of white cotton fabric using Image Maker. If you are not sure how - ask your teacher.



When the Image Maker is dry, soak the paper with a wet sponge and begin rolling the paper away with your finger.



Cut around the picture carefully, place it on your garment or bag, and seal it in place with 3D Paints squeezed around the edges.



You could make a Christmas Stocking and make a Fabric Photo label to put on it! Perhaps you could decorate it with Glitter 3D Paints to make it really special.
